There is the practicalities of whether or not it is allowed to hold a funeral service in a mosque or church, the fact that it may take a month or so to organise a funeral service and there is the emotional farewell to someone who has died. This article covers some of the common misconceptions and important information about the legalities, practicalities and emotional aspects of the funeral process. 1. Are all funerals equal? Every person who has died will be buried. Of course, this may be in a mosque, church, or a cemetery, but it will still be a burial and an important part of the death process. In most instances, the place of burial is decided by the deceased's family, religion, and culture. In Islamic law (shari'a), burial is forbidden in houses, markets and on mountains and hills. In modern practice, burial is the preferred option for the majority of Muslims in Malaysia, but those who have been divorced are given the option of cremation. 2. Who can hold a funeral? Any person over the age of 18 can hold a funeral service, including the deceased, their immediate family members, and friends. This includes the immediate family of the deceased (mother, father, children, sisters, brothers) as well as the spouse of the deceased. 3. Can funerals be held in a church or a mosque? There is no legal restriction on a funeral service being held in a church or mosque as long as it is permitted in the country of residence. The primary consideration is the consent of the appropriate authorities in the country of residence. This could be the municipal council of a town, state and federal government agency such as the Department of Islamic Development Malaysia, the National Registration Department (Jasa Invisi) or the Ministry of Works. There are two main reasons why a funeral service should not be held in a place of worship in Malaysia. The first is because no religious ceremony is performed. There is
